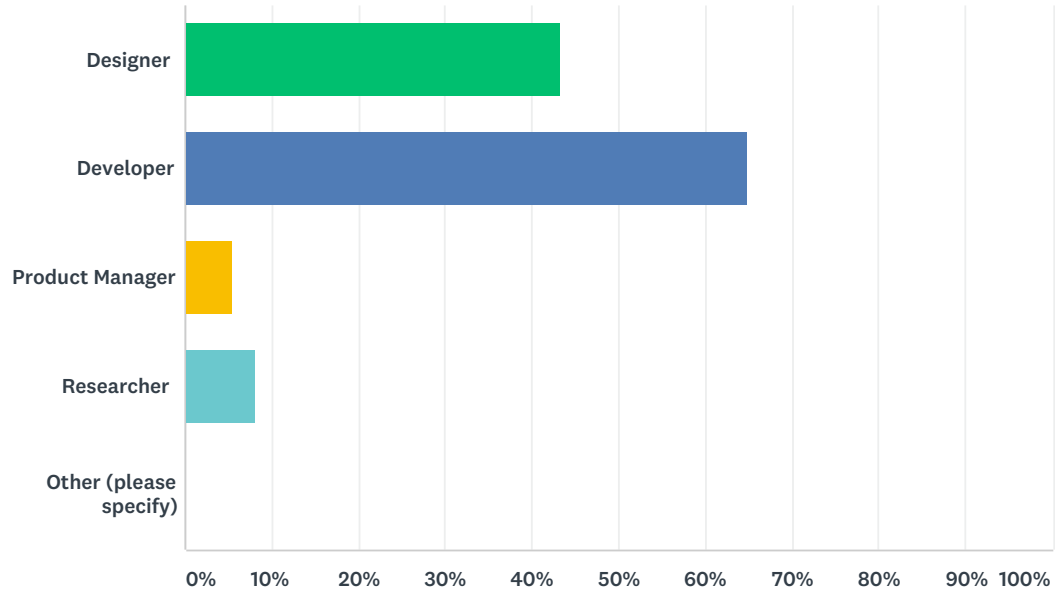


Q1 Your job role

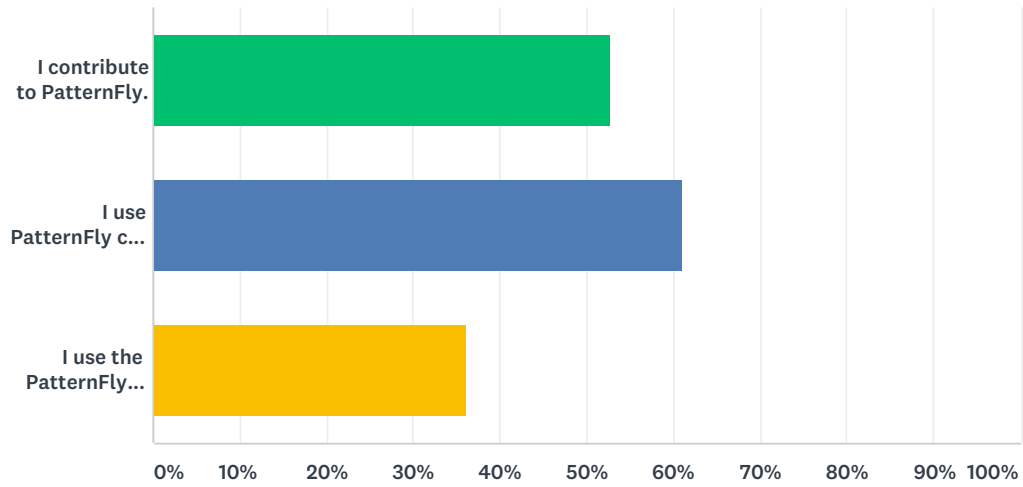

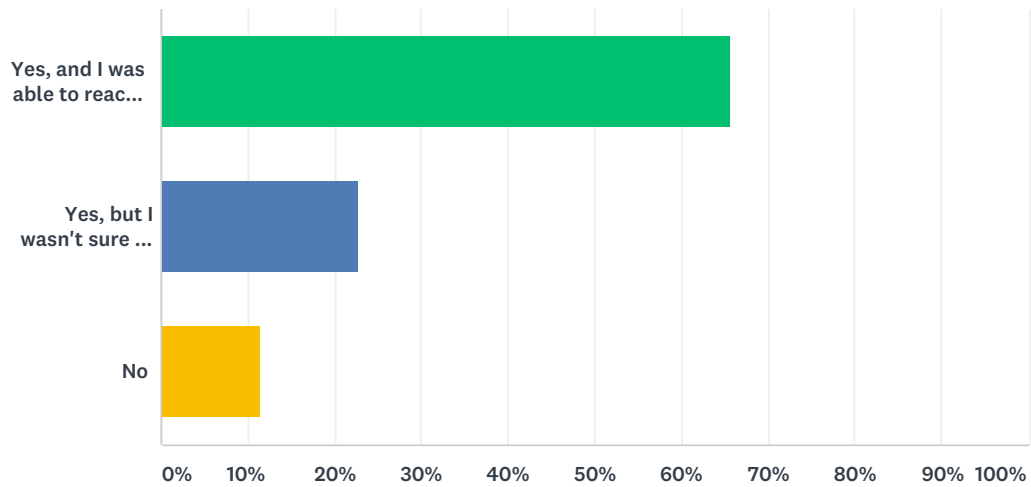

Q3 Have you ever been in a situation in which you needed or wanted to discuss a question/ topic with the PatternFly community?

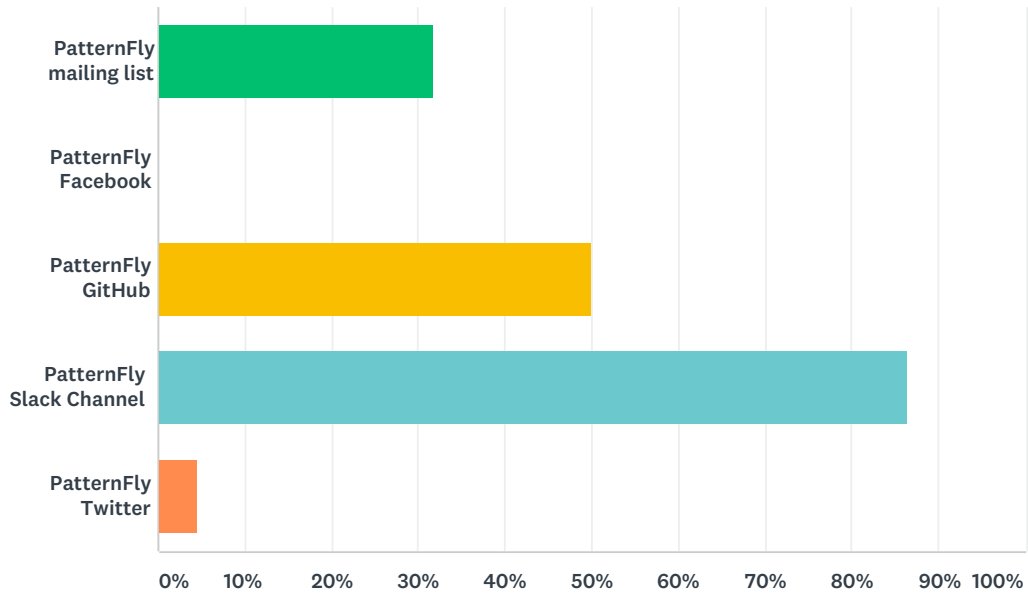

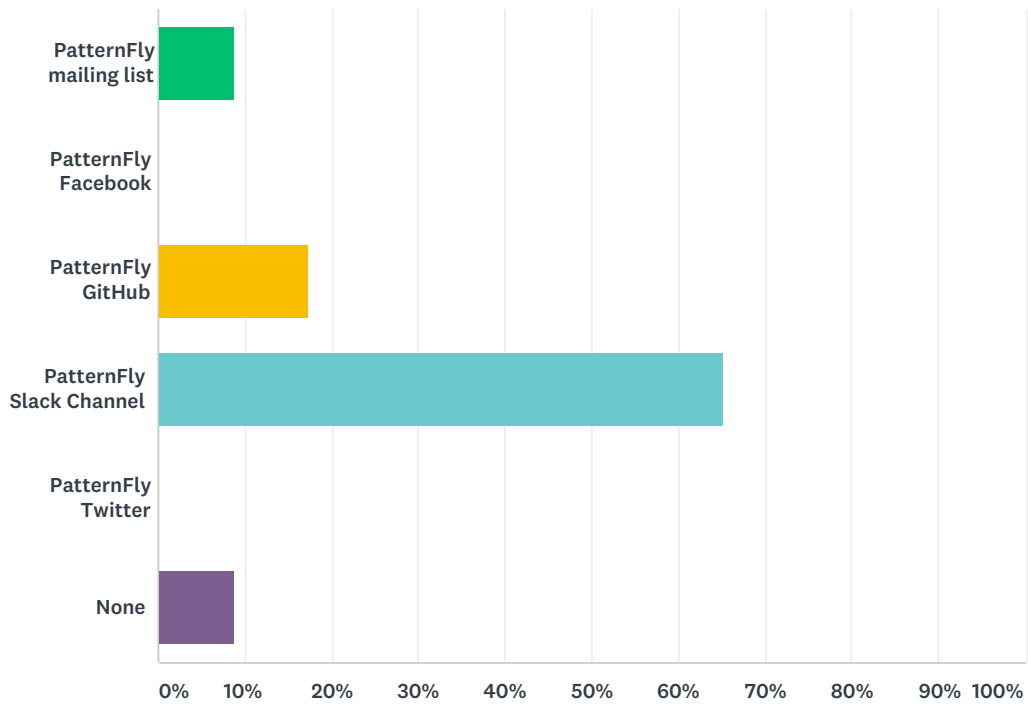

Q5 Which of the following channels is your first choice to discuss PatternFly related topics with the rest of the community?

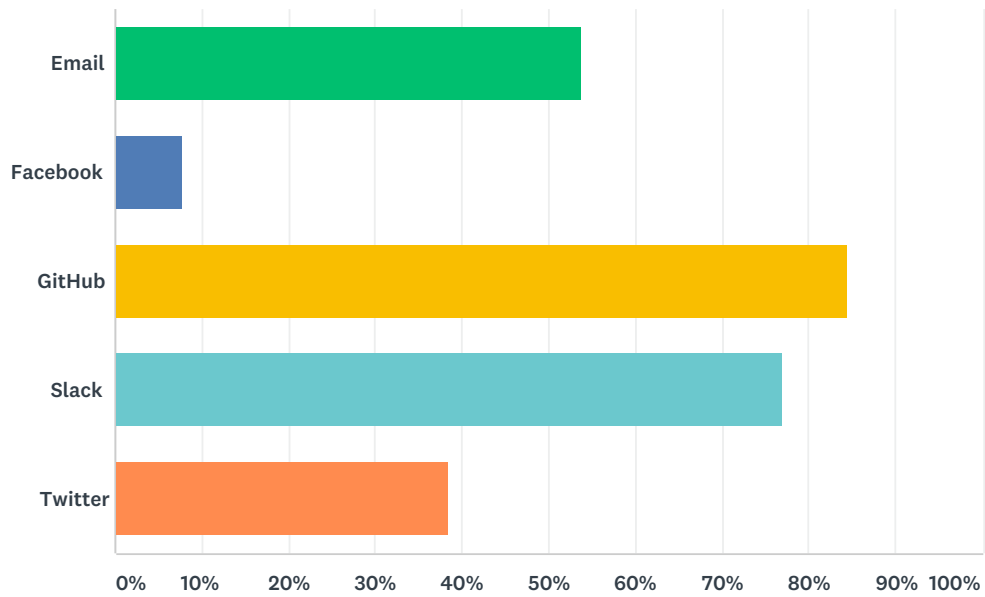

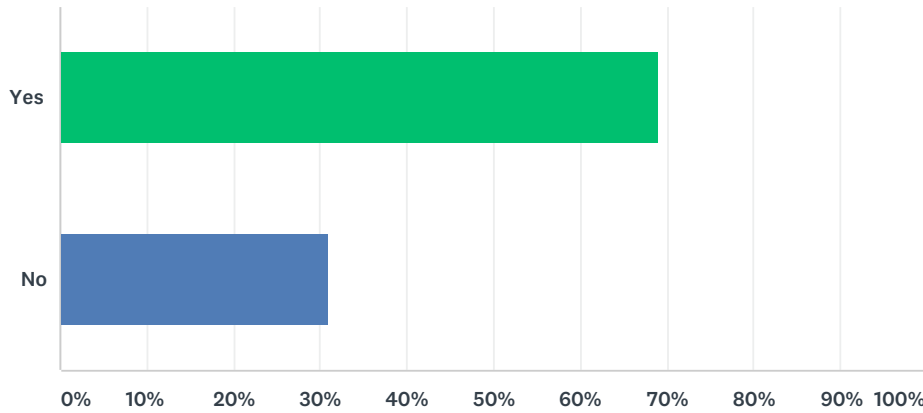
